## February Meeting Recap

At our February meeting our president Robin Langkamp presented “Generational Differences in the Workplace”. Members talked about some of the generational gap experiences they have had with their co-workers. Some stories were quite funny and enlightening. Robin showed a YouTube video of an interview with Megan Johnson with Generations Inc. Megan talked about the different generations and what you need to know to be able to communicate and work with them. Megan also gave a talk at NAWIC’s Annual Meeting & Conference on “Zap the Gap”. Below are some excerpts from her book “Zap the Gap” presentation (Generations, Inc book published by the speaker Meagan Johnson) at NAWIC’s 2016 Annual Meeting & Educational Conference. Megan said to remember that “every generation can add value to an organization”.

### The Traditional Generation – Born Pre-1945

- 8% of the workforce
- Train them one on one
- Many are volunteers; give them a job title
- Frugal – Great sources to help watch costs
- Loyal, Reliable and Hardworking

**#1 complaint** – No one asks their opinion

Remember: Old dogs can still have treats to share.

### Tips:

- Capture and apply the wisdom from their wealth of experiences.
- Help them to embrace new **systems and methodologies**.
- Need an occasional word of acknowledgement.
- Traditionals are very sensitive to public embarrassment.

### Baby Boomers – Born 1946-1964

- 30% of the workforce
- Over 70% will stay on past retirement age
- Ability to get along on their own without much interference but prefers working with a team.
- Works well with others. Help them make a difference.
- Learned to value teamwork. There is no “I” in TEAMWORK.
- Watergate and Vietnam shattered their unquestioning faith in American Institutions

**#1 complaint** – Age discrimination

Remember: The have knowledge and experience to offer.

### Tips:

- Make them mentors.
- Capture the wisdom they offer before it’s too late.
- Keep them motivated and excited about their job.
- Freedom to act on their accumulated knowledge and skills without being micromanaged.

### Generation X – Born 1965-1980, Latch Key Kids

- 17% of the U.S. population
- Parents were often absent due to both working.
- Tell me what you want. Give me the tools. Leave me alone.
- There is an “I” in TEAMWORK.
- Hardworking, responsible, family focused adults.
- Create their own rules, little tolerance for rules that make no sense to them.
- Doing what they enjoy can trump bringing home more money.
- Want schedule flexibility
- They place loyalty with themselves rather than the companies for which they work. They believe that job security rests in their ability to find another job. Sees job hopping as the road to success.

**#1 complaint** – Office politics ( this would also mean chapter politics to us)

Remember: Micromanage them and you will lose their loyalty.

### Tips:

- Logical reason for putting more time in at work. Looking to create family environment. Spending time with their families is important. Don’t want their children to suffer the same fate as they were growing up.
- Their mantra is “Take care of yourself because no one else will.”
- Places a high value on fast-paced action and having fun.
- They have little concept of “paying your dues.” They have figured out how to solve their own problems and find their own way as latch key kids.
- They need individual recognition.
- Job training, job variation, and cross-training raise the odds they will stay.
- Challenge them to think quickly. They tend to like a fast pace and will become frustrated when they feel things are lagging.

**Generation Y – Born 1981-1995**

- 25 % of the U.S. population
- No news is bad news. Feedback is essential.
- High self-esteem
- Expect their managers to have a strong interest in them as people. They expect to be applauded and appraised when they perform well. They expect to be gently corrected when they need it.
- Looking for a sense of belonging and kinship at work. Tend to relate to groups.
- Technology allows work and personal life to overlap. Accustomed to meshing work with personal life.
- Can have trouble with face to face communication. Prefers email/texting to phone calls.
- Considers doing the right thing for the planet important.
- Values volunteerism and puts a high priority of giving back.

**#1 complaint** – Hearing you say “When I was your age...”  
Remember: They can’t imagine being as old as the prior generations.

**Tips:**

- Be straight with them about what you expect. Interact often. Tell them why.
- Create opportunities to bond
- Be open to virtual environments
- Schedule flexibility -Want the freedom to come and go at work rather than logging hours on the clock. They want to work and play at the same time.
- Allow them to connect with others through social media.

**Linkster Generation – Born after 1995**

- 18% of the world population
- Environmental Passion
- Ask them to reverse mentor older team members.
- Give structure and opportunities to interact with full-time employees.

**#1 complaint** – Not being able to do what they want  
Remember: Most are still in school, need to work with their schedules, they are our future.

**Tips:**

- Be aware the influence the parents have and the need to affirm their decisions with their parents.
- They want flexible schedules
- They can’t live without their cell phones.
- They can have a tougher time with face to face communication.
- They may have a short attention span and could lose interest if the work is boring.
- Be specific about expectations that may seem obvious.
- Be clear about consequences of not showing up on time or missing work.
- Discuss dress code – they have a preoccupation with their physical appearance. Fashionable and comfortable. They want their personalities to shine through.


